Dear Families and Whānau

To celebrate Matariki - The Maori New Year, Whitney Street School is having a hangi in conjunction with our normal Matariki celebrations. Council regulations now prohibit traditional in-ground hangi, so we will be using kai cookers.

Across the school, students will;

- learn about the Māori tradition of laying a hāngi
- experience food safety and preparation in a real life context
- experience budgeting, event organisation and management
- work together as a team



The hangi is planned for Term 2 Week 9 Friday 2 July - (serving at lunchtime). Therefore, a lot of the work will be happening on Thursday 1July.

We are planning on charging \$10 for a regular hangi and \$5 for a small.

We will wait and see what is offered in terms of donations and what is on special, closer to the time.

People will have to PRE ORDER their hangi. It will be available for pick up at approximately 1:00pm on Friday 2 July. We are planning on incorporating aspects of environmental awareness so the hangi will be served onto recyclable plates. People will be welcome to eat with us or takeaway.

As with all school hangi, we will be needing a whole lot of help from our community! These opportunities are a great way to offer support for Whitney Street School, meet other families, get involved in your child's education and show you care about our culture and heritage.
